How JACC Works

JACC participants work together with a care manager to develop a plan of care (POC) to best meet their needs. The care manager works with the participant to ensure that services are delivered as planned.

Based on the results of a clinical assessment, the POC is developed collaboratively by the participant and his/her care manager. All JACC participants receive care management services.

By providing a uniquely designed package of supports for the individual, JACC delays or prevents placement in a nursing home.

This program is funded by the State of New Jersey and managed by the NJ Department of Human Services, Division of Aging Services.



About JACC

Dignity Independence Choice

JACC is a program that provides in-home services to seniors at risk of placement in a nursing home. JACC includes an array of services designed to supplement the assistance given by the individual's caregiver network. Qualified individuals may have the opportunity to hire their own eligible family, friends, or neighbors to provide the care they need.

By designing service plans uniquely tailored to the individual, JACC works to enhance the individual's community care options. JACC also strengthens the ability of caregivers to continue in their vital role as primary support providers.





Does the Person You Care for Qualify?

A New Jersey resident age 60 and older who:

- Requires a nursing facility level of care but wishes to remain at home;
- Is not financially eligible for MLTSS (Managed Long Term Services and Supports) or other NJ Family Care program;
- Is not/will stop participating in the NJ Alzheimer's Adult Day Services Program or Statewide Respite Care Program;
- Has resources at or below \$40,000 for an individual, or \$60,000 for a couple;
- Is a US citizen or qualified alien;
- Has no alternate means to obtain the needed support; and
- Lives in the community, and not in an assisted living, nursing home, or residential care facility.
